Literacy Links

*develop pleasure in reading, motivation to read, vocabulary and understanding by:

*listening to and discussing a wide range of poems, stories and non-fiction at a level beyond that at which they can read independently being encouraged to link what they read or hear read to their own experiences

*becoming very familiar with key stories, fairy stories and traditional tales, retelling them and considering their particular characteristics

*recognising and joining in with predictable phrases

*learning to appreciate rhymes and poems, and to recite some by heart

*discussing word meanings, linking new meanings to those already known

*participate in discussion about what is read to them, taking turns and listening to what others say

* know the difference between fiction and non-fiction texts

* know and understand the features of non-fiction texts

*write sentences beginning to sequence them to form short narratives

* identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK and the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles

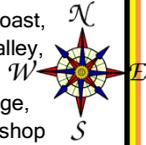
*use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to:
