

## Literacy – Toys in Space,

- Becoming familiar with how stories are structured
- Suggest how a story might end
- Describe the main setting events and characters
- Looks at books independently and handles with care
- Hears and says the initial sounds in words
- Gives meanings to marks as they draw, paint and write
- Beginning to use some clearly identifiable letters
- To write their own name

## Communication and Language

- Responds to two part instructions
- Maintains attention and sits quietly in activities
- Listens to stories with increasing attention and recall
- Listens to others 1:1 or in a small group
- Uses language to imagine and recreate
- Extends vocabulary
- Beginning to use a range of tenses
- Beginning to understand why and how questions

## Understanding the World

- Looks closely at similarities differences patterns and change
- Shows interest in different ways of life
- Shows skill in making toys work
- Shows an interest in technological toys
- Talks about why things happen and how things work
- Children know about similarities and differences in materials

Comparing old toys to new, naming everyday materials and identifying materials of familiar toys. Exploring properties of materials. Exploring a range of old and new toys

## PSED

- Initiates conversation
- Confident to speak to others about needs wants and interests
- Can describe self in positive terms
- aware of boundaries set
- Understands their own actions effect other people
- Adapt behaviour to different situations
